A beautiful

neoclassical painting made in oil on canvas and framed in a contemporary carved and gilded wooden frame. The painting features a notable use of chiaroscuro and shadows and the scene depicts a bacchanal, in the center of which stands out a fainted young man, immersed in the orgy of the party. The young man wears tunics and a necklace with blue stones, while holding a cup and a broken amphora, from which wine was being poured. Around him appear several characters, visible only by their lower limbs, among which you can see tunics and a shoe decorated with stars; finally, there is also a hand. The setting
