body of work. Best known for his contribution to the Art Nouveau movement, his participation in the Orientalist movement is however far from negligible. He is an engaging artist, appreciated by collectors. He exhibited from 1888 to 1906 at the Salon des Artistes Français. In 1891, he received an honorable mention and in 1904 a bronze medal. He also received a silver medal at the Universal Exhibition in Paris in 1900.
