Description

Rare Meiji period Kutani ware figural group of Gama Sennin and disciple with toad - Japan - c. 1880-1900A rare and striking Japanese figural group in Kutani ware (???), dating to the Meiji era (c. 1880-1900). The subject is Gama Sennin, the "Toad Immortal," a legendary Daoist figure symbolising longevity and mystical knowledge. He is depicted here with his disciple, who tenderly cradles a toad--an important creature in Japanese folklore associated with transformation and wisdom. The figures are executed in vibrant polychrome enamels over a warm, creamy earthenware body, highlighted with lavish gilded detailing and raised moriage decoration. This richly textured surface treatment, closely related to techniques seen in Satsuma-style art of the period, enhances the intricate floral and geometric

patterns adorning their robes. Careful hand-painting extends to the expressive faces, showing remarkable sensitivity and characterisation. This is a high-quality export piece likely made in a major Kutani workshop such as Kokuzo-do or Iidaya, reflecting museum-level craftsmanship of the late 19th century. Key identifying features include:Unglazed, creamy clay base with hand-forming marksRed stamped mark "??" (Kutani) partially worn, typical for genuine Meiji-period worksRealistic modelling of facial features, beards, hands, and toadsIntricate, well-preserved enamel and gilded detailTypical of the finest Meiji export wares, this sculpture demonstrates the technical mastery of Kutani artisans in overglaze painting, moriage application, and gilding.
