Description

Louis XVI period wall clock in gilded bronze, made in Paris based on a design by bronze smith Robert Osmond (1711-1789). The original design of the clock, known as the 'grand model ribbon clock' or 'royal model,' is preserved in the INHA library in a collection of clock designs executed between 1755 and 1780 (design reference N/36, inv. VI E 15). A first example was delivered by the clockmaker Lepine in 1767 for the bedroom of Madame Victoire de France at the Palace of Versailles, and a second was commissioned a few years later for the apartments of the Dauphin, the future Louis XVI. Public collections: -A similar cartel clock is on display in the vestibule of the Nissim de Camondo Museum -Another cartel in the Mobilier National collection (inv. GML 7722)
