Three ancient gold children's rings. Roman, 1st -2nd century AD. The largest gold ring is set with a garnet intaglio with a male figure, it measures $1.3 \times 1.1 \times 0.6$ cm and weighs 1.6 grams. The second gold ring is set with a low cabochon emerald, it measures $1.3 \times 1.1 \times 0.5$ cm and weighs 1.1 grams. The smallest gold ring is set with a garnet intaglio of an amphora, it measures $1 \times 0.8 \times 0.5$ cm and weighs 0.8 grams. These incredibly precious, tiny rings are all too small to wear and do not fit on a ring stick; however, they would be beautiful worn as an ensemble on a necklace or displayed as exquisite miniature works of art on the included display stand.
