#### Biography:

Alexis-Joseph Mazerolle (1826-1889), born and deceased in Paris, is a renowned French painter.

After entering the Beaux-Arts in 1843, he distinguished himself with his tapestry designs and decorative art. Awarded several medals at the Salon from 1847 onwards, he began a prolific career as a decorator in the 1860s, receiving commissions from prestigious institutions such as the Conservatoire, the Théâtre de Vaudeville, the Monnaie de Bruxelles, the Opéra Garnier, and the Comédie Française. He also created works for private patrons, such as the Duke of Aumale and the singer Rosine Stoltz.
