This refined drawing combines the expressive head of a man with a series of anatomical studies of flayed arms, rendered with remarkable precision. It reflects the close observation of muscular structure and volume characteristic of studio practices in late 16th-century Italy. The quality of the line, the subtle modelling, and the focus on anatomy recall the investigations carried out within the Florentine circle of Bernardino Poccetti (1548-1612), in the wake of
