Description

This pair of Rocaille-style gilt bronze candelabra, dating from the Napoleon III period in the mid-19th century, is a stunning example of the decorative art of this period. Based on designs by Juste Aurele Meissonnier (1695-1750), architect, ornamentalist and goldsmith to King Louis XV. It is considered one of the figures of the Rococo style. Each candelabra has six scrolling arms, beautifully decorated with foliage and finely chiseled acanthus leaves, demonstrating the exceptional craftsmanship of the craftsmen of the time. The bodies of the candelabra are richly adorned with carvings of putti, ribbon leaves and other vegetal elements, creating a visual harmony and a wealth of detail that captivates the eye. These ornaments add a dimension of fantasy and sophistication, typical of the Rocaille style,
