This charming Louis XVI style mantel clock is a fine example of French decorative craftsmanship, probably dating from the late 19th century. It features a white enamel dial signed Oudin et Marseille, framed by a finely chased gilt bronze case, decorated with a playful Cupid holding a rose and a bow, the classic symbol of love. The cherub sits gracefully on the drum-shaped movement case, which rests on a white marble base decorated with a frieze of gilt scrolls and floral motifs. The sculptural quality of the bronze is remarkable, with intricate details such as the wings, quiver, and the putto's facial expression. The dial has beautifully openworked gilt hands and is flanked by winding holes, indicating a mechanical movement. Note: This clock is sold as a decorative object. The movement has not

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been serviced or tested, and we cannot guarantee its proper functioning. The mechanism appears intact, but is offered as is, without restoration.
