Knotted entirely by hand, it is distinguished by its exceptional finesse with approximately 8,000 knots per square decimeter, revealing elite craftsmanship and remarkable traditional know-how. Motifs: Presence of a sophisticated central medallion, surrounded by finely arranged symmetrical floral motifs. The richly decorated border frames everything elegantly and harmoniously, emphasizing the balance of the design. Colors: Central background: Deep midnight blue, decorated with dense flowers in red, cream and light blue. Central medallion: Carmine red and cream, with subtle details in light blue. Side fields: Fluid gradient from dark
