He is the 9th of 10 children. He claims to have never attended any school and it is very likely that his father taught him the trade. The family arrived in Paris in the years 1907/1908. Roger Favin exhibited for the first time at the Salon of the Société Nationale des Beaux-Arts in 1928. He presented 3 busts there including that of his mother. He participated regularly.
