Pierre Jacques Pelletier is considered the painter of the Parisian suburbs, and the banks of the Seine, but he also painted very often in the heart of the capital, most often in pastel, but he also mastered the oil technique very easily." Pelletier knew how to create a style by assimilating both the lessons of the landscape artists of the Fontainebleau school and those of the Impressionists. A poet, he moves us with his melancholic landscapes throughout the four seasons, with the beauty of his skies. But he surprises us when, becoming retrospectively a fascinating journalist, he describes to us how Paris and our suburbs looked like ... St-Ouen, Gennevilliers, Epinay, Argenteuil, Issy-les-Moulineaux ... - a century ago.....
