Likely crafted in the late 19th century during the Qing Dynasty, this vase is a fine example of Chinese lacquer artistry. Height: 16 cm (excluding wooden stand). Cinnabar is a red lacquer obtained from mercury sulfide, traditionally used in China to create fine decorative objects. The cinnabar carving technique, developed during the Ming Dynasty and refined under the Qing Dynasty, involves applying multiple layers of lacquer, each of which must dry before the next is applied. Once the desired thickness is reached, the artisan

hand-carves floral or landscape designs. The blue enamel interior not only protects the surface but also provides a beautiful contrast that enhances the overall aesthetic.
