Trees, plants, birds, water, etc. An 18th-century Aubusson tapestry is a luxurious wall or floor tapestry hand-woven in the French town of Aubusson, famous for its tapestry weaving since the 17th century. These rugs, often made for palaces and aristocratic homes, are characterized by fine detail, pastel scenes, and classical or floral motifs, such as mythological scenes, flowers, crowns, and cartouches. They reflect the elegant style of the Rococo and Neoclassical periods. Aubusson tapestries were a sign of status and refined taste.
