

Bronze Sculpture, Armed Marianne, 1870s David d'Angers Style, French Republic, 19th Century

Description

Antique patinated bronze sculpture dating from the 1870s. Marianne standing wearing a Phrygian cap. The young woman is depicted holding a rifle, in the style of the work of David D'Angers. At her feet, we can see: Broken chains, representing the abolition of oppression. A severed hand, perhaps a symbol of justice or sacrifice. A key, which may evoke liberation or civil power. Cobblestones or rocks, anchoring Marianne in a context of popular struggle (such as the barricades of 1830 or 1848). Work in good condition, measuring 26.5cm in height.
