MARCHAND André (1877-1951) "Kent, the chestnut horse, 1941" Oil on panel, Signed and dated 1941 lower right, Titled upper left: "KENT", Countersigned and titled on the back by the artist: "KENT", Beautiful work by the animal painter André Marchand which represents a chestnut horse. The details of the horse's body, the play of light and shadow are perfectly mastered. A student of the painters Léon Bonnat, Edouard Detaille and Simon Toudouze, André Marchand is a lithographer and an animal painter. He is a member of the Salon des artistes français from 1898. He receives several awards during his participations including a medal in 1904 and 1920. André Marchand stays in the summer at the Lizelier mill in Iteuil in the Vienne to paint the countryside.
