



Rare Gilded Wood: Early 19th Century Gilded Wood Mirror With Pediment And Column With Mason



Description

A rare mirror with the Masonic emblems of the Square of the Compass, the Pendulum and the eye surmounting a crown. With an ornate pediment and decorated with two Corinthian columns surmounted by a ball. The great finesse of its execution makes for an exceptional piece with high symbolic value. In the general "Neo-Classic" style and from the Charles X period, this generous mirror, like the entrance to a temple, is neat and in very good condition, including its marvelous mercury stain as well as its structure and its original plank background. A piece of 'Curiosity' with high decorative value, whose details such as the openwork capitals of the acanthus leaves of the ornamentation set the tone for this exceptional piece, the consoles with beautiful movement, the pedestals of the
