Five-Horse Stagecoach, Signed Adam, Late 19th CenturyThis charming antique print vividly portrays a lively scene of a stagecoach drawn by five galloping horses--an iconic image from the romantic era of horse-drawn travel. The work is signed "Adam" within the plate, in a style reminiscent of Victor Adam (1801-1866), a renowned French artist known for his dynamic depictions of horses and travel scenes. While the attribution is not formally confirmed, the piece stands out for its graphic quality and narrative strength. The scene is preserved in its original oak frame, both simple and sturdy, typical of the late 19th century. The work is protected by its original glass. It is in very good overall condition, with some light age-related marks on the paper, which only enhance the piece's authentic
