An exceptional and rare large-format black basalt plaque, made by Wedgwood circa 1800. These early monumental plaques are rare due to the technical difficulties involved in producing such large and flawless reliefs in basalt ceramic: few examples were made, and even fewer have survived in such good condition. Description This impressive piece features a mythological scene inspired by classical antiquity, masterfully carved in high relief. The composition features a dynamic group of figures engaged in a lively narrative, probably inspired by Greek mythology. The figures, with their elegant anatomical precision and expressive movement, capture the vitality, sensuality, and hedonism that fascinated late 18th-century European art and culture. Artistic significance This plaque reflects the Neoclassical revival of the late Georgian period, when interest in ancient Greece and Rome, sparked by archaeological discoveries and the travels of the Grand Tour, dominated the decorative arts of Europe. Wedgwood's basalt ware was at the forefront of this movement, admired for its aesthetic and technical innovation. Dimensions: Main plaque: $60 \text{ cm} \times 26 \text{ cm}$ Secondary plaque: $43 \text{ cm} \times 9 \text{ cm}$ Both pieces are presented in complementary, newer frames for wall display. Condition: The plaques are in excellent original condition with minimal wear. The newer frames provide secure and elegant mounting, ready for display.
