An interesting and delicate oil painting on canvas by a Basque artist at the end of the 19th century, entitled "Nicolina," as indicated by an inscription at the bottom of the work.  
Description  
The portrait shows a young woman depicted half-bust-length, in a serene attitude, with a gently turned face and a melancholic gaze typical of 19th-century aesthetics. The composition is distinguished by its warm palette and earthy tones, as well as its loose but precise brushwork, which suggests an early Impressionist influence. The neutral background contrasts elegantly with the details of the face and dress, giving the scene an intimate and secluded atmosphere. The work is signed in the lower right corner, although the signature is illegible,

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suggesting that it could be by a lesser-known regional painter or an artist active in local circles at the time.
