### Description

This biscuit group, attributed to Louis-Simon Boizot (1743-1809), is a work of great finesse and timeless beauty. It depicts an allegorical scene entitled "The Offering to Love." This piece, although apocryphally marked Sèvres, is characteristic of the production of the second half of the 19th century, a period when the art of porcelain reached peaks of refinement and technicality. The composition depicts a cupid, or putto, standing on a richly decorated altar. This central figure, a symbol of love and innocence, is receiving offerings. In his hands, he holds a basket containing doves, emblems of peace and purity. The two women draped in antique style, who surround him, also offer him flowers, adding a touch of grace and delicacy to the scene. These women, with their flowing drapes and elegant

poses, evoke figures from classical mythology, recalling the lasting influence of Antiquity on European art. The oval base on which this sculptural group rests adds a dimension of stability and balance to the ensemble. It also serves to highlight the minute details of the figures and the altar. The 35 cm height of this piece makes it a modest object, yet imposing enough to attract attention and inspire admiration. The overall condition of this work is remarkable, testifying to the care and attention paid to its conservation over the years. The details of the faces, hands, dove feathers, and flower petals are rendered with a precision that demonstrates the exceptional skill of the artisans of the time. In short, this biscuit group is not only an example of the art of porcelain, but also a window onto the values and aesthetic ideals of the 19th century. It embodies the quest for beauty, harmony and perfection that animated the artists and craftsmen of this period. This piece, with its touching allegory and exquisite details, continues to captivate and inspire those lucky enough to contemplate it.
