The sword, symbol of courage and nobility, is delicately sculpted here, with a quillon adorned with a ball of lapis lazuli, a deep blue, bringing a touch of refinement. The scabbard, connected by a fine gold chain, helps protect the sword, adding a symbolic dimension of mastery and wisdom. This pin can be worn elegantly on a tie, but also on the lapel of a jacket, adding a touch of distinction to a masculine outfit. The pin is presented in its original case, marked "Anton, Antwerp, Belgium" (ANTHON), in French, testifying to the jewelry tradition of the
