Description

Jacques BOUYSSOU, born in 1926 near Honfleur in Calvados and died in January 1997, is a French painter. From his childhood, Jacques Bouyssou met artists such as Othon Friesz, Raoul Dufy, and Lagar Leprin, who became his mentors. He also met Moïse Kisling, Fernand Léger, and Ossip Zadkine. Bouyssou studied at the Troyes School of Architecture and Fine Arts and drew with the sculptor Janin. He moved to Paris and became a student of Othon Friesz and Lucien Simon at the Académie de la Grande Chaumière. His talent as a painter was recognized, and his first exhibition took place in London in 1955. The following year, Katia Granoff invited him to exhibit in Paris. It was the beginning of a long relationship. His first exhibition took place at the Salon des Artistes
