



Tatanua Mask, Malagan Mask, Tabar Islands, Papua New Guinea, Oceanic Art, Tribal Art



Description

Rare Malagan dance mask collected on the Tabar Islands in Papua New Guinea. This mask, called "Tatanua," represents a person's soul and is used in commemoration ceremonies. These relatively light wooden masks are worn during ritual dances. This one was notably used during a large ceremony held in February 2020 on Tatau Island. Wood, plant fibers (notably coconut and pandanus), coconut bark, pigments, and shells. Sold with a presentation base. Approx. 47 x 44 x 13 cm / EUR1 800 including base and shipping.
