France, 19th century A superb pair of antique-inspired neoclassical vases, after the famous Warwick Vase, made in France around 1880. These imposing pieces are cast in richly detailed patinated bronze with a gilt interior and rest on solid green-veined marble bases. The decoration, borrowed from the Bacchic iconography of Antiquity, features expressive masks of Bacchus, vine garlands, panther skins, and classical ornamentation in high relief. The twisted handles, shaped like coiled stems, add a harmonious sculptural movement. Each bowl rests on a molded foot, itself mounted on an architectural marble pedestal.
