Bus station bench designed by designers Kiyonori Kikutake and Itsuko Hasegawa in the 1960s. This bench is distinguished by its minimalist and functional design, typical of the Japanese approach to public furniture. It illustrates Japan's commitment to combining design and utility in public spaces. This bench features three seats made of molded, fiberglass-reinforced plastic, tinted throughout in orange-red, providing comfortable and ergonomic seating with asymmetrical armrests. The seats are supported by a chrome-plated metal frame, ensuring strength and durability. Ideal for furnishing an entrance or outdoor garden.
