Description

Circular in shape, this small container is intended to refresh an individual glass by dipping it in crushed ice or cold water. It has two side handles, or "ears", finely modeled in the shape of shells, decorative motifs typical of the rocaille taste in vogue at that time. The whole rests on a small circular pedestal, ensuring both stability and visual lightness. Hard-paste porcelain White background with polychrome decoration of jets of flowers and florets. Blue and gold threads on the edges. Circular container in metal or ceramic, intended to refresh a single glass by dipping it in crushed ice or cold water. Cylindrical in shape, it is molded at the base and at the top, and rests on a small low pedestal. It has two rocaille handles Marks: Painted with a brush with an intertwined double "L" - Decorator: "DT" for DROUET
