"Édouard Pecquereau, born on May 5, 1836 in Paris, worked with his father, Jean-Théodore Pécquereau, in 1862 at 5 rue du chemin Vert. His brother-in-law, Achille Gilbert, joined the family business in 1867 to become Pecquereau Père et Fils and Gilbert Gendre. He kept the business with the latter in 1874, becoming Pecquereau
