Description

Mahogany and mahogany veneer chest of drawers opening with three drawers from the Empire period. It is topped with a black marble "Belgian granite" and rests on front claw feet and rear feet with three decreasing balls, called a rosary. The chest of drawers handles are in the shape of a lion's head and the keyholes are decorated with a wreath of flowers. This chest of drawers has a fire mark of the Château d'Eu and inventory number 1676 twice. "Château d'Eu - a summer residence with a royal destiny. Upon the death of his mother, the Eu estate passed to the Duke of Orléans, the future King Louis-Philippe. The new owner of the place was passionate about architecture and history and it was with him that the estate would experience its greatest developments. In 1827, the architect
