Listed model titled "Sultan" appearing in the photo on the cover of the book -Camille Tharaud "The Art of Grand Feu Porcelain" by the author Jean-marc Ferrer, Lucien Souny edition 1997- Dimensions: 21 cm x 17 cm x 15 cm. Very good general condition, electricity up to standard while having retained its original elements in burgundy bakelite. enamel in its thickness before firing. A feat which
earned him the highest distinction at the
Decorative Arts Exhibition in 1925 His pieces
were exhibited in Paris (Salon of Decorative
Artists, 1928-1933), at the Universal Exhibition
of 1937 and even in New York (Collective
Exhibition of Limoges Porcelain Makers, 1939)
