Art Nouveau period sculpture from the late 19th century signed A. NELSON (sculptor Anton Nelson 1849-1910) model listed on page 302 of the book prefaced by Félix Marcilhac "Etains 1900" - Two hundred sculptors of the Belle Epoque by Philippe Dahhan - Beautiful Symbolist subject entitled "Fleur de Rêve" featuring a silver-plated tin nymph resting on a marble base. Good condition, dimensions: 57 cm high X 36 cm wide. Antoine Nelson, is a Belgian sculptor born in Brussels in 1849 and died in 1910. Coming from a family of artists, he is the son and student of the sculptor Auguste Van Den Kerckhove. Active from 1880, he acquired a significant reputation in the field of sculpture.
