



Pair Of Wall Lights With Winged Putto Heads, Attributed To Claude Galle



Description

A remarkable pair of gilt bronze sconces, demonstrating the meticulous work of Claude Galle, one of the most eminent Parisian bronze makers of the period.Each sconce features a unique symmetrical composition with three very finely scrolled light arms, resting on a base adorned with a mascaron depicting a winged putto. This motif, typical of the neoclassical style, evokes the influence of antique models rediscovered during the century. The finely chiseled bobeches rest on petal-shaped cups, lending a great lightness to the ensemble. At the top, a vase adorned with foliage rests on a rectangular base like the pedestal of an antique sculpture. It completes this refined work, combining elegance and history. The quality of the carving, the richness of the details of each
