DIAMOND-SHAPED BRASS STAMPED IN RELIEF, IT IS STAMPED IN RELIEF WITH THE NUMBER 130 AND IT WAS FRAMED WITH A DOUBLE PROJECTING MOULDING. THESE DIMENSIONS AT THE TIME WERE 10.5 CM X 9.3 CM OF THE 1810 MODEL. MOVING SHAKO PLAQUE FROM THE SPANISH CAMPAIGN OF THIS SOLDIER OF THE 130TH LINE WHO MUST HAVE LOST HIS LIFE ON THE FRANCO-SPANISH BORDER IN 1814. THE HOUND OF THE YEAR IX RIFLE COMES FROM THE SAME PLACE FOUND 1 METER FROM THE PLAQUE. AS WELL AS THE BULLETS. FROM THE REDOUTIES OF AINHOA ON THE FRANCO-SPANISH BORDER. MOVING REMAINS OF THE FACE-TO-FACE SOULT
