Literature Between 1615 and 1621 Rubens painted a group of large scale works of hunting canvases depicting visceral scenes of human and animal conflict, which were inspired by works by Stradanus and earlier Flemish tapestries. These expressive and dramatic works were popular in courtly circles and were often commissioned by noble patrons for their hunting
