Description

Ceramic tile decoration with garrigue plants as motifs, a recurring leitmotif of the artist. The structure is made of metal. The tiles, designed from 1968 to 1982, are handmade using a technique that involves pressing real leaves into the clay and disintegrating them during firing, leaving a finely detailed imprint. Roger Capron lived and worked in the south-east of France for 60 years. Beautiful patina of time on the metal. Signed on the top. Very good general condition. Dimensions: 103 x 44 cm H: 30 cm. Renowned French ceramic artist. Studied first at the École des Arts Appliqués in Paris, then at the École Nationale Supérieure des Arts Décoratifs. In the 1940s, he worked briefly with the famous Swiss ceramist Jean Derval. In 1946, Capron founded his own ceramics studio in Vallauris, on the

French Riviera. The region had already been renowned for its pottery since Picasso's arrival in the 1940s. His creations, ranging from vases to ceramic tiles to furniture, are distinguished by their vibrant colors and bold geometric patterns.
