Reduction compass with crossed legs, made of chromed brass and steel, English manufacture from the 19th century. It is an instrument used to enlarge or reduce a drawing; it was mainly used by cartographers, engineers, and artists to precisely resize drawings and maps. It has two arms, each with a slot in which a movable pivot slides, held by a screw. The reduction compass was invented by the Swiss scientific instrument maker Jost Burgi (1552-1632) in the early 17th century. This instrument derives from the Roman "whole and half" compass, an ancient example of which was found among the ruins of the Roman city of Pompeii.
