Tibet, 19th century, superb element of ritual adornment in yak bone depicting Buddha seated in the position of taking the earth to witness (Bhumisparsa Mudra) on the upper part and the representation of a human skull on the lower part. Also called "shamanic adornments", these tantric aprons are worn by Buddhist monks during the "cham" dances which are celebrated each year within the monasteries in Tibet. These rituals feature the gods and heroes of Buddhism. Good condition. Dimensions without the base: Height 10.6 cm (16.3 cm with the base).
