Description

Important and splendid bronze bust of Napoleon I, signed "R. Colombo" (for Renzo Colombo), dated 1885 and stamped with the seal of the Paris World's Fair in 1889 where it received the silver medal. It is presented with the symbol of the French Empire: an imperial eagle with outstretched wings holding thunderbolts in its talons. Superb brown patina. Edition from the last quarter of the 19th century. Excellent overall condition. Powerful and determined expression of the emperor. The sculpture presented here is the most luxurious version offered at the time. Indeed, this bust was sold in several sizes -- the largest was, as here, 57 centimeters high. Finally, he settled in Paris in the early 1880s and exhibited at the Paris Salon in 1883, 1884 and 1885.
