Description

Camille FLERS (1802-1868) cottage and peasants oil on canvas signed lower right 47x39cm 61x54cm framed (relined) Camille Flers, born February 15, 1802 in Paris and died June 26, 1868 in Annet-sur-Marne (Seine-et-Marne)[, is a French painter. He is attached to the Barbizon School. Flers is the eldest of the naturalist school] of 1830. This "romantic-naturalist", as he calls himself, is one of the first to work on the motif in the forest of Fontainebleau, in Barbizon, where he joins Jacques Raymond Brascassat (1804-1867), Antoine-Louis Barye (1795-1875) or Alexandre-Gabriel Decamps (1803-1860). He lived in Paris only in winter and for seven years. From 1848 onwards, he was considered one of the masters of the realist movement. Camille
