### Description

Materials: Architectural Form: The clock presents a stately urn-shaped body, meticulously carved from white marble, evoking the grandeur of classical antiquity. The main body is adorned with subtle fluting, leading up to a finely molded pediment that gracefully frames the dial. Contrasting Marbles: The clock elegantly combines the pristine white marble of its main structure with a contrasting rectangular plinth of rich griotte marble, providing a striking visual

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anchor. This two-tone marble construction underscores the Empire style's penchant for sophisticated material contrasts.

**Classical Finial:** Surmounting the urn, a perfectly spherical white marble finial adds a touch of classical purity and understated elegance, completing the clock's balanced silhouette.

**Horological Integration:** The circular white enamel dial, pristine and legible, features refined Roman numerals and slender blued steel hands. The dial is set within a finely molded ormolu (gilt bronze) bezel, providing a subtle accent of warmth and luxury. While the maker's signature is not immediately visible, the quality of the movement is implicit in the clock's overall construction.

**Supporting Base:** The entire ensemble rests upon a stepped rectangular base, composed of the contrasting griotte marble and a larger lower section of white marble, which in turn is supported by four delicate gilt bronze toupie feet, adding stability and a touch of refined ornamentation.

**Period Significance and Craftsmanship:** Dating from the early 19th century, this clock perfectly encapsulates the elegance and imperial grandeur of the French Empire style (circa 1800-1815). This period, influenced by Napoleon's campaigns and a renewed fascination with classical antiquity, favored straight lines, architectural forms, and a more restrained yet powerful aesthetic than the preceding Louis XVI era. The predominant use of high-quality marble, combined with meticulous carving and subtle gilt bronze accents, testifies to the exceptional skill of the Parisian artisans of the era.
