Islamic bronze mortar with Kufic inscription -Mamluk or Syria, 13th-15th centuryImportant cylindrical bronze mortar with a wide collar and flared base, richly decorated with a raised calligraphic frieze running around the entire upper and lower rim. The inscriptions are written in the flowery Kufic style, typical of the prestige production of Mamluk or Levantine workshops. Description The body features geometric and arabesque motifs, including floral triangles, stylized drops, and interlaced knots, evoking the votive and symbolic decorations of classical Islamic art. The inscription, partially deciphered, ?????? ??? ????" "Glory, victory, permanence, and royalty belong to God alone." This type of mortar, used to grind spices or medicinal
