What we present in a box frame is a reduced sample woven by a silk weaver intended to be presented to priests to demonstrate the expertise of his workshop. It therefore presents all the most virtuoso possibilities possible so that the priest can choose the decor that suits him for his future chasuble. Gold cloth, gold and silver thread embroidery, everything is combined to seduce the customer. Long protected certainly under tissue paper, the brilliance of the materials is preserved.
