



Teapot, Jean-baptiste-claude Odiot, First Empire In Silver



Description

Teapot from the First Empire period in solid silver with the guarantee hallmarks for first-grade silver (950%) from the Paris guarantee office for the period 1809-1819. It is from the hand of the famous and prestigious master goldsmith Jean-Baptiste-Claude Odiot (1763-1850), son, grandson and father of a goldsmith, he is without a doubt the most famous member of this dynasty of Parisian goldsmiths. Supplier to members of the Emperor's family, of whom Madame Mère was his best customer. The cradle of the King of Rome is without a doubt his most famous work. After the restoration of the Bourbons, he continued his commercial success by supplying to more or less all the crowned heads of Europe. The teapot is engraved with a wedding coat of arms topped with a crown. The coat of arms of

the wife, who was a member of the Jehannot d'Huriel de Bartillat family, Marquis d'Huriel et de Bartillat, are present.
