The title is adorned with the beautiful typographic mark of Théodore Payen (Theobaldus Paganus), a renowned Lyon printer. Rare edition Only 50 copies are believed to have been printed at the time (ref: Master by Morgane Perrier on Theodore Payen). This is the last known copy to date. Prestigious provenance Bookplate and collector's stamp of Justin Godart (1871-1956), politician and humanist from Lyon: Mayor of Lyon after the Liberation Minister, MP, lawyer
