Delicately modeled pair of German porcelain sweetmeat figures, attributed to the Volkstedt manufactory, Thuringia, c.1880. Each figure represents a young girl standing with one foot raised upon a reticulated basket, holding a bird in her hand and wearing a dotted classical-style tunic.

The rococo-style scroll bases are molded and

painted in pastel tones.

the bases an underglaze blue crossed-swords mark typically used by Thuringian porcelain factories emulating the well-known crossed-swords mark of Meissen in the 19th century.
