800 thousandths silver and crystal planter, Friedländer silversmith, Germany, late 19th century. Charming 800 thousandths solid silver planter, resting on four openwork feet, and garnished with a thick molded crystal bowl with cut edges. This beautiful piece is a German work from the end of the 19th century, signed in full Friedländer, a silversmith renowned for his decorative pieces in the Rococo style. The frame features a high-quality openwork decoration, combining leafy volutes, rocaille shells and oval cartouches decorated with floral trellises. The vigorous relief of the arabesques alternating with the openwork parts creates a refined play of light and shadow. The interior is covered with thick, perfectly adjusted blown crystal, which reinforces the contrast between the brilliance of the glass.
