They had a protective and auspicious role. Here, the lion holds a pearl in its mouth and rests on a pedestal engraved with the character ? (Fú). This character, which can be translated as happiness, is a protective and auspicious character, often present on the doors of houses in China in order to attract or preserve happiness and good fortune.
