Description

A finely cast bronze figure of Tara, seated in lalitasana (royal ease pose) atop a double-lotus base. The figure is adorned with detailed jewelry including a crown with central seated Buddha image, circular earrings, necklace, and armlets. The body is elegantly modeled, draped with a sash across the chest, and the legs feature delicate engraved scrollwork and floral motifs. The left hand rests gracefully on the base beside a stemmed lotus flower (padma), while the right arm rests on the raised knee in a relaxed and compassionate posture. The statue is traditionally sealed with a copper

The statue is traditionally sealed with a copper base plate, repoussé stamped with a vajra (thunderbolt) motif -- a ritual feature characteristic of Nepalese Newar Buddhist workshop bronzes from the late 19th to early 20th
