Victoire-Louise-Marie-Thérèse and Sophie-Philiooine-Elisa-Beth-Justine] each had their own library, the volumes of which were, for the most part, dressed by Fournier, bookseller and bookbinder in Versailles". (in Guigard). "Of the three daughters of Louis XV, Madame Adélaïde is the only one who has made her mark among the true bibliophiles". (in Quentin-Bauchart). The copies held by Marie-Adélaïde were covered in red morocco, those of Victoire, olive-green; finally, those of Sophie, in lemon morocco.
