The Artist:

Eutrope Bouret (1833-1906) was a renowned French sculptor and a student of Louis-Charles-Hippolyte Buhot. A regular exhibitor at the Paris Salon starting in 1875, Bouret is celebrated for the elegance of his figures and the precision of his detailing. Subject: An allegory of innocence through the "Broken Pitcher" motif.

Signature: Signed "BOURET" in the cast on the base (terrasse).

Title: Includes an original brass nameplate on the plinth: "LE POT CASSÉ PAR BOURET".

Craftsmanship: Exceptional chasing work, particularly visible in the lace-up bodice, the folds of the skirt, and the melancholic facial expression.

Base: Integrated circular stepped base.

Excellent condition. Original patina is well-preserved with no missing parts or restorations.
